FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I keep a picture on my mantle of my grandmother, my Bubi Sarah, dancing at my wedding. If you've heard me tell her story of surviving the Holocaust, you know about her love of dancing. I look at the photo each morning as I make my coffee. It's my daily reminder of why the work we do at 3GNY is so important.

This past year has been full of growth and impact for 3GNY. We provided a record number of WEDU presentations, reaching more students and community members than ever before with personal family stories from the Holocaust. Each presentation, delivered by one of our dedicated volunteers, creates an opportunity for people to get to know a survivor through their grandchild, and to understand how the Holocaust still affects and informs their world today.

This year also marked our robust return to in-person programming, bringing together 3Gs, 2Gs, friends, and supporters to connect, learn together, hear from survivors, and even to see a Broadway show. At the same time, we continued leveraging virtual platforms to create and support community in powerful ways, from sharing our family stories in WEDU Wednesday presentations to hosting webinars and online discussions on a wide range of topics. And as our supportive community grew, we proudly partnered with 3G leaders around the country and the USC Shoah Foundation to create Living Links, the national network of 3G organizations.

<u>Your support, participation, and encouragement drove our impact - THANK YOU!!</u> I am so grateful to partner with each of you to keep the stories and lessons of the Holocaust relevant and meaningful for our world today. With antisemitism and hateful rhetoric on the rise, our work is more important than ever.

After sharing Bubi Sarah's story in a classroom recently, I received a note from a student. As we highlight the impact we've made together this year through this Annual Report, I'd also like to share this student's simple message. It's a potent reminder of why we carry on our grandparents' legacy by educating future generations.



3GNY's programs and events help create meaning and connection in our community. By coming together to learn, share, and socialize, we create a supportive network that empowers 3Gs to embrace the responsibility of carrying on their family legacy, while connecting with peers over our shared experiences as grandchildren of survivors.











Highlights Include:

- Intergenerational Brunch
 - 65 3Gs, family, and friends shared a meal and heard from survivor Aron Krell
- Latkes & Learning Service Project
 - Partnered with Blue Card to write Hanukkah cards to survivors in NYC area
- 3GNY Stories Live: WEDU Wednesdays
 - Featured 3 WEDU speakers sharing their stories in these public virtual sessions, while adding to our YouTube testimony archive
- Leopoldstadt Broadway Outing
 - 70 3Gs and supporters took in Tom Stoppard's Tony-winning play, followed by an intimate O&A with the cast and crew
- Yom HaShoah Commemoration
 - Hosted a meaningful remembrance program using the Hitkansut Haggadah, a new resource from the Shalom Hartman Institute
- Monthly 3G Forum Meetings
 - 3Gs met on Zoom to discuss a wide range of topics relating to the 3G experience, hosted in partnership with other regional 3G groups


